WHAT ARE YOU HERE TO DO?

Happy New Year Brothers. As we enter upon our 177th year of continuous operation as a Masonic Lodge, we might take time to reflect upon how great it is to be a Mason, especially here at Graham. In reflection, it is also a good time to reconnect on what it is we are here to do.

I sometimes wonder what it was like to meet in that first lodge with brothers like William King, J.D. Giddings, and John Sayles. I imagine it looked a lot like San Felipe, but beyond the physical did they leave their stresses and cares at the door? Was lodge a place of refuge from the still wild west, trauma still fresh from the Texas Revolution, and the terror of the yellow fever epidemic? Walking through the old cemetery provides us a quick education on just how unsure those times were. So many stones mark the graves of the way too young.

Masonry is enjoying a resurgence despite a culture largely moving towards isolation and the profane. We do not recruit or pursue members yet good men are knocking at the door (or finding the website). When people ask what it is we stand for, our response is "Making Good Men Better." As we plan for the future, how are we being intentional in our goal to remain true? Are stated meetings enough to keep the brethren from becoming disenfranchised, or is there more.

I have been fortunate to have conducted numerous interviews, formal and informal that I hope we can use as a guide in the future. It has been great and there is more to come. In doing the research we found that there have been ups and downs in this lodge as with any other institution of historical significance. There have been divides created over the years that resulted in brothers stepping away. There have also been monumental successes. A society of gentlemen can be a complicated business.

We were at a funeral recently and the pastor told a truncated life story of a brother that none of the Graham folks had ever met. Yet we knew him. The story goes that as a young businessman our brother was chided by his co-workers for reading his bible at lunch, yet he did not waver. When told by superiors to force directives that were immoral, he did not comply. In the middle of an extremely busy period of business, took time away to go fishing with family. A man of composure and poise when others failed. A man who would do anything to donate his time helping others. This is what we are about.
